Flu Shots are available by appointment only on Tuesday, September 17; Friday, September 20; and Friday, September 27. Please stop by the Administration Office with your insurance card to pick up a consent form and schedule an appointment.

Fire Alarm Testing in Resident Rooms

We are required by law to test all fire alarm devices annually. On the following days an inspector from CSS, our alarm company, along with a Plant Operations Team Member, will knock on your door. If no one answers, they will call down to the Switchboard Operator to call your house telephone. If no one answers the telephone or the door, they will enter your apartment, perform the test (which takes around 30-60 seconds), then exit the apartment and lock the door. If for some reason you do not want us to enter when you are not home, please call the Plant Operations office by 3:00 p.m. on Monday, September 23, to make other arrangements to have the test done. Testing will begin 8:30 on Tuesday, September 24, and end on Friday September 27.

We appreciate your patience and cooperation during this annual inspection.

Amendment Changes Passed

All proposed Amendments to the Resident Association's Constitution & By-Laws were passed by a substantial margin at the September 9th Floor Meetings. Look for upcoming information on when copies of the revised Constitution & By-Laws will be available in the Administration Office.

Will You Be Here Tonight?

Please let the Front Desk Operator know if you will not be eating in the Dining Room on a particular day, if you plan to be away from the Village overnight, or when you return to the Village from being away overnight. This information will assist us in our daily security checks.

Fire Alarm Reminders

As a reminder, when the fire alarm rings, as in any Facility wide emergency, DO NOT CALL THE SWITCHBOARD OPERATOR EXCEPT FOR MEDICAL OR OTHER EMERGENCY. If an actual emergency condition exists, the Operator will be handling important calls and should be interrupted as little as possible. Refer to your "When the Fire Alarm Sounds" handout, your Resident Manual, and stay tuned to channel 732 for additional information during a fire alarm. Remember, by order of the Fire Department, during a fire alarm, please close your door and windows and remain in your apartment until further notice. If you are in a common area, stay where you are until advised differently.

The Jungle Prada Site and Anderson / Narvaez Tocobaga Indian Mound

Join us on a journey through 1,000 years of Florida's history on a 75-minute guided tour on Wednesday, October 9. The admission cost is \$10 per person and is payable at the park. The Village bus will leave at 10:15 a.m. This walking tour will be a leisurely stroll with many places to stop and rest along the way.

Upon arrival, we will gather for our tour at *Jungle Prada de Narvaez Park* on Boca Ciega Bay in St. Petersburg, located across the water from John's Pass Village. From there, we will walk through a gated entry separating the private property owned by the Anderson family from the city park. The Jungle Prada Site is the best-preserved American Indian Site in Tampa Bay, and the historic landing site of Alvar Nunez Cabeza de Vaca. This hidden oasis is the best-kept secret in St. Pete. The 3-acre waterfront property features an archaeologically pristine Tocobaga shell midden mound, lush gardens full of native and Florida-friendly plants, and dozens of free-roaming peacocks!

Family-owned since 1940, the Anderson/Narvaez Mound is on the National Register of Historic Places, and is recognized as the 1528 landing site of Panfilo de Narvaez. A historic marker placed here by the Archdiocese of St. Petersburg proclaims the Jungle Prada as the location of the first Catholic Mass in Florida.

After our tour it is off to *Big Jim's* in Seminole for lunch "on your own".

In 1966, J.B. and Muriel Watson formed the *Channel Markers for the Blind*, an organization providing the same services offered at *Sight Center* for residents in northern Pinellas County. In 1984, the two organizations merged to become *Pinellas Center for the Visually Impaired*. Then, in August 2005, the name officially changed to *Lighthouse of Pinellas*.

Lighthouse of Pinellas is the only private, non-profit agency providing vision rehabilitation training for individuals of all ages who are residents of Pinellas County, under one roof. Their programs are accredited by the *National Accreditation Council for Blind and Low Vision Services*.

Game Night On




